General Open Rules

The official Shawnee County Fair will be held at the Kansas ExpoCentre, 1 ExpoCentre Drive, Topeka, Kansas, July 21 thru July 24, 2011.

No pre-entry is required on open class exhibits **except** Scarecrows and Quilt Show. Exhibitors should check individual department rules for times entries are accepted and judged.

All exhibits will remain in place throughout the Fair. **[Entries may be picked up in Exhibition Hall from 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm on Sunday, July 24.]** See individual exhibits for times.

The Shawnee County Fair Association, its officers, directors, manager and superintendents cannot be responsible for any damage, loss or injury to exhibitors, or other persons, while on the ExpoCentre Grounds whether loss or damage arises from an accident or any other cause.

The decisions of the judges are final and no appeal will be considered.

Where there is no competition, no champion award will be given. Articles will be awarded first through eighth place according to merit. No premium money will be paid except for the County Cookie Jar, Commissioners' Bread Basket, Land of Kansas Food Basket, Largest Tomato, Largest Zucchini, Scarecrow and Professional Decorated Cakes.

Checks for the winners of these classes will only be paid when the exhibit is picked up on Sunday. **ALL CHECKS MUST BE CASHED WITHIN TWO WEEKS OF RECEIPT.**

Each exhibitor is limited to one exhibit in each class **except** where division rules state otherwise. (Open Antique, County Cookie Jar, Commissioners' Bread Basket, Land of Kansas Food Basket, Largest Tomato & Largest Zucchini, and Flower Show **are excluded** - see individual categories.)

All cars and trucks admitted to the ExpoCentre Grounds exhibit areas and barns must be removed to the parking lot after loading and unloading.

ONLY ANIMALS ON EXHIBIT WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE EXPOCENTRE GROUNDS WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THOSE NEEDED FOR THE HEARING AND SEEING IMPAIRED.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE NOT PERMITTED ON THE EXPOCENTRE GROUNDS.

SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN ALL BUILDINGS.

3. May use eggs made of other materials, such as wood, plastic, Styrofoam, etc.
4. Any safe product can be used to decorate the egg.
5. Egg must be in a container for display such as egg carton or any other container to keep it safe **OR** be able to stand alone.
6. One decorated egg per display per person may be entered.

1. Exhibits will be judged and ranked in each class according to merit. Ribbons will be awarded to the top eight entries.
2. Only one entry per class per exhibitor. (Classes 5500-5525)
3. Cut flower specimens must be grown by the exhibitor. (Classes 5500-5523)
4. Cut flower specimens need to have variety and specimen name on entry card.
5. Cut flower specimens must be displayed in clear, CLEAN, inexpensive GLASS containers or vases (that can be disposed of if not claimed at close of fair). NO plastic water bottles. Container should be in proportion to the specimen.
6. Refer to information pamphlet "PREPARING CUT FLOWERS AND HOUSEPLANTS FOR EXHIBIT", 4H-826 for proper exhibiting guidelines.
7. Exhibitor may enter up to three Floral Design Arrangements (Classes 5540-5548). See "FLORAL DESIGN GUIDE" for help.
8. Exhibitor shall furnish containers appropriate for the Floral Design and other necessary items.
9. Floral Design Arrangements should be made from garden grown and/or collected materials. Purchased materials are acceptable. Artificial flowers are not allowed. See "FLORAL DESIGN GUIDE".
10. Miniature Arrangements should be no bigger than 6 inches in height, width, or depth with container no taller than 2 inches. See "FLORAL DESIGN GUIDE".
11. Dried materials must be clean and in good condition.

12. Entries should not take over two square feet of table space.
13. The County Fair will NOT be responsible for the loss, damage, or storage of any flower arrangements, vases, or containers. Containers cannot be picked up until release time on Sunday.
14. Exhibitor is responsible for maintaining water in Floriculture exhibits during the fair.

1. Exhibits will be judged and ranked in each class according to merit. Ribbons will be awarded to the top eight entries if there are sufficient entries to merit.
2. Exhibitors entered must be the work of the exhibitor.
3. Commercial mixes may be used only as an ingredient in a special recipe. Entries made solely from a commercial mix will not be allowed.
4. **Two copies of recipe on 3" x 5" cards must accompany each entry.**
5. Low acid foods such as vegetables and meats must

be processed in a pressure canner. High acid foods such as fruits, pickles and relishes, jams and jellies may be processed in a water bath.

6. Perishable foods are not allowed in Yeast Breads, Quick Breads, Cakes and Pies. Perishable foods are those with custard and cream cheese type fillings and frosting or foods requiring refrigeration. For more details, contact the Extension Office at 232-0062 for the publication *Food Safety Recommendations for Safe Fair Exhibits*.
7. Cakes are to be layer cakes using 8" or 9" pans. Pies may be baked in 8" or 9" pie pans. Decorated Cakes must have the top layer, real cake, the rest can be something else.
8. Exhibits shall be placed on plates or cardboard then placed in a plastic bag. Decorated cakes do not need to be covered.
9. Following judging, a portion of each entry (except canning) will be placed on exhibit with any ribbons won.
10. Lesaffre Yeast Corporation awards "RED STAR" items to the best three exhibits in classes 5190-5194.

1. Open to non-professional groups or individuals. Exhibit should reflect the Fair Theme: **Sunflower Classic**.
2. Exhibit consists of a decorated basket filled with 6 miscellaneous yeast breads (loaves and/or 6 rolls individually wrapped in clear plastic) using at least 2 kinds of yeast dough.
3. Include with exhibit a sample of each kind of bread for judging. Samples should be individually wrapped and placed in a small box. Basket will count 30% and breads 70% of judging.
4. Two copies of recipe on 3" x 5" cards must accompany each entry.
5. Premiums are as follows: First place - \$40; Second place - \$30; Third place - \$20. **Winner must pickup premium check by the end of the fair.**
6. First place basket will be presented to the County Commissioners.

1. Open to non-professional groups or individuals. Exhibit should reflect the Fair Theme: **Sunflower Classic**.
2. Exhibit consists of a decorated basket filled with 1 entry from each of 4 different class categories of the Foods Division (e.g. one canned food from Food Preservation, 1 loaf of bread from Yeast Breads or Quick Breads, 1 cake from Cakes, and 1 plate* of cookies from Cookies). *1 plate is six of the particular item (e.g. six muffins, six cookies, six dinner rolls, etc.). Items must be wrapped for freshness.
3. Include with exhibit a sample of each item for judging. Samples should be placed on a paper plate or covered cardboard and wrapped. Basket will count 30% and food 50% of judging.
4. Two copies of recipe on 3" x 5" cards must accompany each exhibit.
5. Premiums are as follows: First place - \$40; Second

place - \$30; Third place - \$20. **Winner must pickup premium check by the end of the fair.**

6. Baskets will be presented to the Fair Sponsors. Please make sure things are wrapped well.

3. Jar of fancy assorted cookies must contain not less than 5 or no more than 10 kinds of cookies of a good size for serving.
4. Two copies of recipe on 3" x 5" cards must accompany each entry.
5. Cookies must be visible in jar.
6. Each cookie shall be wrapped in transparent wrap.
7. Bring 1 sample of each kind of cookie and identify so the judges will not need to open the jar.
8. Jar to count 30%, quality of cookies count 70%.
9. Premiums are as follows: First place - \$20; Second place - \$15; Third place - \$10. **Winner must pickup premium check by the end of the fair.**
10. Cookie jars will be presented to the Fair sponsors, so please make sure they are wrapped well.

4. All work must be that of the entrant.

7. Pies must be in a round pie dish either 8" or 9" in diameter. (We cannot guarantee the return of the pie dish.)
8. Two prizes (1st and 2nd place) will be awarded each day of the contest.
9. Pies will be sold by the slice following judging. All proceeds will benefit the Shunga Valley 4-H Club.

1. Judging will be based by guidelines according to the *Exhibiting Fruits and Vegetables* publication number C-405, available at your local County Extension Office.
2. Exhibits will be judged and ranked in each class according to merit. Ribbons will be awarded to the top three entries if there are sufficient entries to merit.
3. Exhibits must have been grown and harvested during the 2011 season.
4. Specimens need to be free from blemishes. Any produce that is unsatisfactory to show may be excluded by the superintendent.
5. Wheat and Oats exhibits shall consist of 1 gallon, exhibited in glass jars (preferably large opening), belonging to exhibitor. Crop must be grown by the exhibitor in 2011. All entries must be made under the variety name.
6. Wheat and Oats exhibits will be judged on the basis of seed quality, uniformity, commercial grade, and condition.
7. Largest Tomato & Largest Zucchini premiums are as follows: First place - \$30; Second place - \$20; Third place - \$10. **Winner must pickup premium check by the end of the fair.**
8. Vegetables are judged on same size of product, same varieties on the plate, and equal number.
9. Please take all extra vegetables with you if they are not being entered.

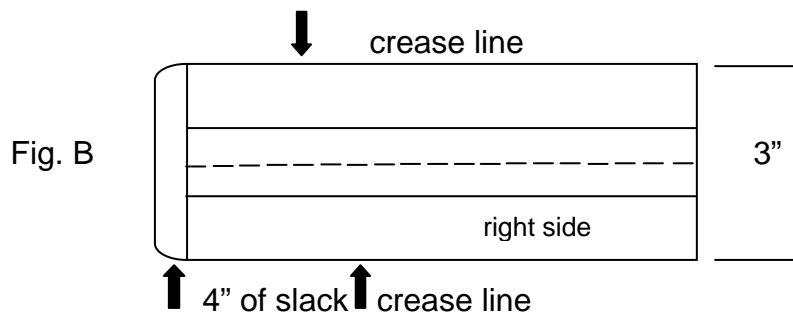
Tailoring a Sleeve for Your Quilt

Any quilt or wall hanging entered in the show should have a sleeve – tube of fabric – attached to the back, at the top, allowing it to be hung.

Cut a strip of fabric (muslin or other fabric) 8" wide and an inch longer than the quilt edge to which you'll attach it. Machine sew the long edges together with the wrong sides together, making a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam (see Fig. A). Hem ends for a neat appearance.



Lay the tube on your ironing board so that the seam is up and centered. Press the seam open. Then press two crease lines, each $1\frac{1}{2}$ " away from the center seam. There will be 3" between the two crease lines closest to the long seam, leaving 4" of slack (see Fig. B).



Place the seam side down and pin the top crease to the top back of your quilt, leaving about 1" between the top of the sleeve and the top of the quilt. Slip-stitch the tube to the backing fabric. Sew along the tube's two creases, allowing the 4" slack to hang free. If you are hanging a large quilt, it is recommended that you make your stitches go through the front of the quilt to help support the quilt better.

NOTE: Sleeves must be sewn onto the quilt, NOT PINNED. All small and large quilts must have a sleeve sewn on that allows at least $3\frac{1}{2}$ " of space. **SMALL AND LARGE QUILTS WITHOUT SLEEVES OR SLEEVES THAT ARE TOO NARROW WILL NOT BE SHOWN.** Sleeves are not needed for the Mini Quilts.
